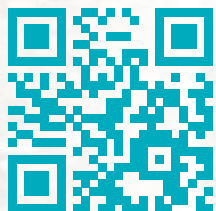

DAY 5 Learn about yourself in the leadership workshop. Enjoy a live raptor presentation by Hawk Quest. Play in the volleyball tournament. Camp talent show!

DAY 6 Tour Trapper Coal Mine and Craig Generation Plant. Enjoy the end-of-camp banquet.

DAY 7 Return home.
